








oldest oil raffinerie, founded in 1875, organized by volonteers


opening of the oil shale mine in 1916, wich is still running.

Oil Museum Bobrka





The world's first oil field in Bobrka was founded in 1854. The wells were sunk manually, with shovel and pick.

In 1852 **Ignacy Łukasiewicz** started the research on crude oil for technical and lightning purposes

Romania National Oil Museum



open since 1957

The museum belongs to the oil industry (Petrol)

The first oil raffinery was built 1856 in Ploisti

The industrial oil production started 1857 in Romania

The first mechanical drilling was made 1861 (150 m deep)

1924 oil mine in Buzau, still running






Hungarian Petroleum Museum



The Museum of the Hungarian Petroleum Industry (MOIM) is a professional, trade museum with the collecting circles throughout the country. It was founded to gather, work up and present the more than 100 years history of the Hungarian hydrocarbon industry in its exhibitions and publications.

Deutsches Erdölmuseum




founded in 1970 on the old oilfield Wietze,

where the industrial oil production started in 1899 (cradle of the German oil industry)

where an oil mining opend in 1920






Beside the exhibition objects the oil museums keep different kinds of archive material
